

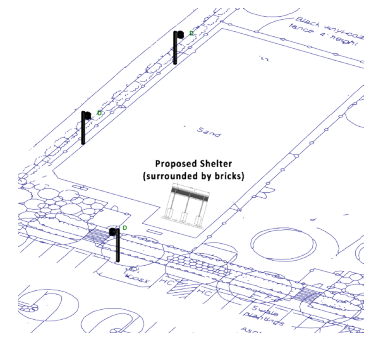


Hondo Dog Park



Winter Area Shelter Project

A local Girl Scout and the Hillsboro Dog Association are working to raise funds to install a shelter in the winter area so park users can have protection from rain and sun while their dogs exercise!



Project Details

The proposed new shelter will be 18 feet wide by 10 feet deep with a paver pad underneath. It will enable dog owners to stand under cover while supervising their dog in the winter area. This project has been proposed as a result of dog park user feedback for a shelter for year-round use of the winter area. This project is being funded by donations that will be acknowledged by custom engraved bricks. These bricks will be installed around the shelter area with options to extend them around the perimeter of the dog park someday.

About Hondo Dog Park

Hillsboro's first and only off-leash dog park opened in 2007 and is located near Hillsboro Stadium. Named in honor of Hillsboro Police K9 Dog Officer "Hondo" who lost his life in the line of duty in 1997, the park features nearly four acres of space, including a large mixed-size dog play area, a small/timid dog area, and a special winter use area.

Hillsboro Dog Association's Role



The Hillsboro Dog Association (HDA) is a 501(c)(3) charitable organization separate from the City of Hillsboro and is the official adopter of Hondo Dog Park. The mission of HDA is to enhance the quality of life of dogs and their owners through support of dog parks in the Hillsboro community. HDA members help with beautification projects at Hondo Dog Park and work to educate and serve as a

resource for dog park users. Volunteer members of the HDA and a local Girl Scout who is earning her Silver Award are working together to make this project possible.

Donation levels are available as described below and are acknowledged by custom engraved bricks. Subject to Hillsboro Parks & Recreation Commission approval, bricks may say anything appropriate for a public park, such as the name of the sponsor, a business name (no company logos or slogans), a pet's name, or in memory of a loved one. A brick donation is a contribution to the Hillsboro Dog Association, a tax exempt public charity under IRC Section 501(c)(3), and depending on the donor's tax situation may be tax-deductible. Bricks will be installed in the dog park winter area in summer/fall 2011 .
